Everyday Matters

In supporting our tamariki and their learning, we will be celebrating tamariki attendance.

We feel that the best way to do this is to recognize tamariki who attend school every day at the end of every 2 weeks, and tamariki who have attended every day for a whole term at the end of the term.

Please find attached to this paanui, a flow chart that guides us to when we should engage with the Attendance services

The chart next door shows the effect of absences on tamariki progress

1 or 2 days a week doesn't seem that much but...

If your child misses	that equals...	which is...	and over 13 years of school that's...
1 day a fortnight	28 days per year	4 weeks per year	Nearly 1.5 years
1 day a week	40 days per year	8 weeks per year	Over 2.5 years
2 days a week	80 days per year	16 weeks per year	Over 5 Years
3 days a week	120 days per year	24 weeks per year	Nearly 8 years

The effect of absence on progress

A whole year has 365 days; a school year has 190 days. That leaves 175 days to spend on family time, visits, holidays, shopping and other appointments.

Best chance of progress and success. More likely to be socially happy.

Harder to make progress or experience success. Harder to make friend and more

This is persistent absence and very hard to make progress and social outcomes are often poor.
